## Q: What does a nonprofit attorney actually do?

## Q: What are the most common legal mistakes nonprofits make?

The most common include inadequate bylaws that don't reflect how the organization actually operates, failure to properly manage conflicts of interest at the board level, misclassification of workers as independent contractors when they should be employees, falling behind on state charity registration renewals, and operating programs that have drifted outside the scope of the organization's stated exempt purpose. None of these issues start out as crises — they typically begin as small oversights that compound over time. The good news is that a periodic legal checkup with an experienced nonprofit attorney can identify and address these issues before they become serious problems.
